This 4-hour training will provide EI service coordinators and providers with an opportunity to gain a broader understanding of this important resource in early intervention, as well as to learn about a new model of AT service delivery in Colorado. The training is required for EI providers who want to become EI AT Consultants for their local CCB(s), but service coordinators and other providers are highly encouraged to attend. It will also be a precursor to a web training for the AT Consultants only.
