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Steps to becoming a Colorado Early Intervention Assistive Technology Consultant

1. Review the Early Intervention [Assistive Technology Consultant Guidelines](#) and [FAQ](#) for clarification on the roles and responsibilities of the position.
2. Talk with the Program Coordinator at the CCB(s) you serve to determine how AT consultants are utilized within the CCB EI program and how you might fit in. AT consultant roles and utilization can vary between CCB's.
3. Either have attended the November 2016 statewide live training in person or [view it online](#).

5. Complete the 4 online training modules for [Assistive Technology in Early Intervention](#) and upload your certificate of completion to the [EI Colorado website provider portal](#).
6. Contact [Brian Burne](#) at Assistive Technology Partners to let him know you have completed the trainings and are ready for [loan library](#) access. You will receive the loan library agreement and a loan library account will be created for you. More detailed info on getting set up with the loan library can be found in the [FAQ](#) document.
7. Let your local CCB know you're an AT Consultant and that you can help borrow equipment, provide AT consultation and referrals, or even complete AT evaluations in your area of expertise.
